



WE'RE GLAD YOU ASKED!



Question: Why did our homeowners annual assessments go up again this year? What do they even go towards?

Answer: Thank you for a great question. Due to the 7.5% inflation over the last 2 years, in conjunction with the increased cost of vendors, services and utilities, we have all seen the cost of doing business increase. Our homeowners association has been impacted as well. The Board of Directors continually works to negotiate contracts, bids and monthly expenses to help decrease budget needs, and the 5% increase on the dues was imperative for the operational budget.

The yearly dues go towards things like maintenance of the grounds throughout our large and amazing community, utilities and services such as electric and water for the park, pool, tennis/pickleball court and basketball courts, as well as insurance, payroll for our fulltime maintenance man, and administrative fees. Other expenses include facility and amenity maintenance and upgrades (like the new park playscapes and wood chip padding), resurfaced tennis and basketball courts, new decking on pool area and pool house upgrade. We also include savings to the reserve monies of the HOA for future upgrades and repairs.

We hope this helps, and hope you have a wonderful holiday season.

Recipe Corner

How to Thaw a Turkey

Ideally, place the frozen bird into your refrigerator upon bringing it home from the grocer—hopefully several days in advance, since it can sometimes take nearly a week to thaw completely. This is a tried-and-true method; its chief drawback remains that it's also the most time-consuming. Plan on 24 hours of fridge-thawing for every four to five pounds of turkey, says ThermoWorks; thus, for a 15-pound bird you can expect to wait about three days. (See the full timetable below.) This is best if you have an auxiliary fridge in the basement, but probably a bit inconvenient otherwise.

Another tip: You'll definitely want to set the turkey on a rimmed baking sheet or in a roasting pan while it thaws to keep any running juices contained.

How long to defrost a turkey in the refrigerator:

Thawing time is based on bird weight; again: you will know the bird is fully thawed when it reaches an internal temperature above 32°F. Per the USDA:

4 to 12 pounds — 1 to 3 days 12 to 16 pounds — 3 to 4 days 16 to 20 pounds — 4 to 5 days 20 to 24 pounds — 5 to 6 days

The fastest way to thaw a turkey: Submerge turkey in ice water, even a 24-pound bird can be defrosted in just 12 hours (Thermoworks says to count on about 8 hours for a 15-pounder). Either submerge turkey in sink or in a bucket. Regularly check the water's temperature to make sure it never gets about 40 degrees. Monitor the proceedings as often as every half hour, and if you see the temperature venturing in that direction, add more ice to set it straight

New City of San Antonio Budget Focuses on Property Tax & Keeping San Antonio Safe

On September 14th, the City of San Antonio's Mayor and City Council approved a \$3.7 billion budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 that was presented by City Manager Erik Walsh. The budget provides day-to-day services that residents have come to enjoy and rely on, from parks, libraries, police, fire to garbage collection. Thanks to direct feedback from the residents of San Antonio, the budget also focuses on long-term investments that will provide property tax relief, help keep San Antonio safe, enhance quality of life and improve customer service.

The budget is balanced over a two-year period, in accordance with the City's established financial policies. It also maintains a minimum 15 percent General Fund ending balance and keeps public safety spending below 66 percent of the General Fund.

The City's strong financial management was key to Standard & Poor's and Moody's Investors Service reaffirming its 'AAA' general obligation bond ratings. Fitch Ratings also reaffirmed the City's 'AA+' bond rating and revised its outlook to positive from stable.

The Adopted Budget At A Glance

- \$3.7 billion
 - 1.6 billion General Fund
 - \$1.33 billion Restricted Fund
 - \$798 million Capital Budget
- \$134 million in property tax relief





Property Tax Relief

Providing direct relief to the residents of San Antonio was identified as a priority in this year's budget. In June, the Mayor and City Council unanimously approved to double the City's homestead exemption to 20 percent. Today's Council action also slightly decreases the City's property tax rate.

The budget also maintains existing exemptions, including the over-65 and disabled person exemptions of \$85,000 each and the senior property tax freeze. In total, the budget delivers \$134.5 million in property tax relief to the residents of San Antonio in 2024.

Keep San Antonio Safe

One of the top priorities of the City's residents and the City Council was keeping neighborhoods, businesses and public spaces safe. The budget adds 117 police officers, 41 Fire and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) positions and 29 animal care services positions.

To boost community safety, 100 new police officers will enhance proactive patrols and five new officers will be assigned to the training academy to graduate more cadets. Thirty-two new firefighters and paramedics and one new EMS unit for Fire Station 40 will be added. EMS coverage to the Southside of San Antonio will also be bolstered to help shorten patient transport time after the closing of the Texas Vista Hospital.

To further the City's progress to improve mental health crisis response, the City will expand the successful San Antonio Community Outreach and Resilience Effort (SA-CORE) program to include 24-hour coverage, seven days a week beginning in the summer of 2024. The expansion adds five clinicians, nine paramedics and 12 police officers. The SA-CORE team is made up of a team of a clinician, paramedic and police officer respond to 911 mental health calls. Together, this team compassionately responds to these calls for service by securing the scene, while a clinician and paramedic address physical and mental health concerns. The team transports and/or connects the patient with services and follows up regularly with the patient.

Animal Care Services (ACS) receives its largest increase by adding 15 positions to focus on the safety of our community and the well-being of the pet population. With the additional resources, the department will be able to cut response times to its roughly 3,500 annual bite cases nearly in half. ACS will increase compliance by owners of dogs that have been deemed dangerous by conducting additional inspections, and it will respond to more critical calls, including those that involve aggressive dogs, neglect and cruelty. This budget begins year one of a three-year strategy to respond to all critical animal related calls.



Landscape Watering

We are currently under STAGE 2 of SAWS restrictions for landscape watering. This means watering with a system can be done only once a week between the hours of 7:00 AM to 11:00AM and 7:00PM to 11:00pm on the days assigned by the last digit of your house number.



Fall for Less Water

Your landscape is preparing for its long winter's nap. That means it doesn't absorb as much water, and soil evaporation drops significantly.

Autumn is the ideal time to stop widespread watering — especially with your irrigation system. It's as easy as 1-2-3.

- **Cut run times in half.** For a lawn in full sun, reduce the run time from 22 minutes to 11 minutes.
- **Use the seasonal adjust.** If your controller has this feature, use it to decrease all settings by 50 percent.
- **Turn it off.** If rainfall is below historic averages, you can run your system manually.

Basketball Courts

Encino Park has some amazing amenities to offer to our residents. One of the amenities is our basketball courts behind the community center. They are constantly used for an easy game of pickup, or weekly games with residents. Things to remember though, regarding the basketball courts:

The basketball courts are for residents only. Of course, our residents can invite non-resident friends to play, but there needs to be a resident with them.

The basketball courts are key access with our neighborhood issued card key. Propping the door or jamming it can break the door, which can lead to safety concerns and costs associated with repairing the locks. If the card key is not working, please contact the HOA Office at the Community Center.

The basketball hours are 8am–8pm. Yes, in the summer the daylight hours are longer, but we have the earlier end time due to close proximity of neighboring houses to the basketball courts.

Key Card Update

Encino Park amenities (basketball courts, tennis courts, pool and outside pool restrooms) can be accessed with just one card. If you have any key card issues, please contact the HOA Office at 210-497-3022 or stop by

during office hours, Monday and Friday 9-2 or Wednesday, 12-6 and we can get a new card for you. Replacement cards are \$10, the office only accepts checks or money orders, no cash or credit cards.
