LANDSCAPE WATERING

We are currently under STAGE 2 of SAWS restrictions for landscape watering. This means watering with a system can be done only once a week between the hours of 7:00 AM to 11:00AM and 7:00PM to 11:00pm on the days assigned by the last digit of your house number. Watering by hand is allowed any day and any time. With the hot weather approaching some areas of your lawn may become under watered or parched and hand watering may be used to address this situation. Keeping your lawn adequately watered using a system and any additional hand watering can help avoid the expense of having to replace any dead grass. Some households use this hand watering as an opportunity to get older children, either at home or in the neighborhood, involved as a way for them to make some summertime spending money.

KEY CARD UPDATE

This past year, we have changed our key card system so all of our amenities (basketball courts, tennis courts, pool and outside pool restrooms) can be accessed with just one card. As with all new things, there have been some glitches with the system. Some of our older keys cards have gone kaput; they just have not accepted the new system. If you have had any key card issues, please contact the HOA Office at 210-497-3022 or stop by during office hours, Monday and Friday 9-2 or Wednesday, 12-6 and we can get a new card for you. Replacement cards are \$10, the office only accepts checks or money orders, no cash or credit cards.

Market Days and General Information

- 1. There are two inside areas: The Bay Area (9'x9' booth space) and the Banquet Area (4'x6' booth space with 6' table & 1 chair provided).
- 2. Outside booth spaces are approximately 10'x10' and are located either on concrete or grass. Vendors must provide their own protection from the elements. A canopy is recommended.
- 3. Display backdrop (provided by exhibitor) **not to exceed 6' in height.** No display backdrops may be used at indoor table spaces.
- 4. One vendor per booth only, with **no subletting, sharing or re-leasing** of the booth space.
- 5. All vendors are expected to operate for the full duration of the Market Days event.
- 6. The staff will assign vendor locations. Returning vendors may request specific locations, and every effort will be made to honor requests, but cannot be guaranteed.
- 7. Pictures of crafts or items to be sold must be provided with the application form. EPWC reserves the right to make the final decision regarding acceptance. We ask that all art/ merchandise be in good taste and that you DO NOT display nudes, profanity, obscenity or objectionable materials. The EPWC reserves the right to ask any vendor to remove a specific item or entire booth for failure to comply with these guidelines and no refunds will be given.
- 8. For Vendors who are interested in selling home-made food items, this website should answer all your questions: http://www.texascottagefoodlaw.com. Be advised that we are not responsible, nor do we have any knowledge about the lawful manner to do this. We simply provide you with a rental space for the weekend.
- 9. Your reservation is not final until payment has been received. **There is a \$25 returned check fee that must be paid before the event** if your check is returned by your bank to us.
- 10. In September, you will receive a confirmation email which will include your booth location, additional event information and flyers. Please help us help you by copying/emailing the flyers and passing them out and/or displaying them at other shows.
- 11. Market Days @ Encino Park is advertised in many ways: ad in the SA Express News, banners on highly trafficked streets, neighborhood newsletters, flyers, Facebook, many craft fair websites and on our HOA web page.
- 12. Set up for inside vendors will begin Friday night from 6-8pm. Doors will close promptly at 8pm and re-open on Saturday morning at 7:00am. NO EPWC ORGANIZERS WILL BE ON THE PREMISES UNTIL 6PM FRIDAY. It is imperative that once you have unloaded, you move your vehicle so that other vendors can unload.
- 13. There is no security provided on Friday night. Any vendor setting up on Friday does so at their own risk.
- 14. DO NOT PARK YOUR VEHICLE AROUND THE PARK / COMMUNITY CENTER DURING SHOW HOURS. Encino Rio Street Parking should be available for your customers! Vendor parking is at the pool parking lot or side streets (Creek Country or Creek Hill).
- 15. All vendors participating in our show MUST upon checking in donate an item from your product line for our EPWC Holiday Silent Auction. All monies raised are donated to a local charity.
- 16. Each vendor is responsible for removing from their booth and any trash/garbage.
- 17. Alcoholic beverages of any kind are not allowed. Food and drinks will be sold. A vendor may bring in food/drink for personal consumption. Smoking is not permitted.
- 18. Add \$25.00 for any applications postmarked after September 6th.All payments made after September 6th must be in guaranteed funds (cashier's check or money order). Entry fee will not be refunded after September 6, 2023.
- 19. Should COVID-19 Guidelines prevent gatherings of large groups or have restrictions that impact Market Days full refunds will be given.

BASKETBALL COURTS

Encino Park has some amazing amenities to offer to our residents. One of the amenities is our basketball courts behind the community center. They are constantly used for an easy game of pickup, or weekly games with residents. Things to remember though, regarding the basketball courts:

The basketball courts are for residents only. Of course, our residents can invite non-resident friends to play, but there needs to be a resident with them.

The basketball courts are key access with our neighborhood issued card key. Propping the door or jamming it can break the door, which can lead to safety concerns and costs associated with repairing the locks. If the card key is not working, please contact the HOA Office at the Community Center.

The basketball hours are 8am-8pm. Yes, in the summer the daylight hours are longer, but we have the earlier end time due to close proximity of neighboring houses to the basketball courts.



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CRIME & SAFETY COMMITTEE

Our SAFFE Officer, Arturo Castellanos, reports that in the San Antonio northside vehicle burglaries continue to be a problem. He advised these five tips:

- Use a steering wheel lock.
- Hide your valuables from plain sight.
- Lock your vehicle and take your keys with you.
- Park in well-lit areas and well-attended parking lots.
- Never leave your vehicle running or unattended. Criminals only need a few seconds to take your vehicle and everything and everyone in it.

School is back in session so please drive safely and observe the rules of the road. SAPD receives lots of complaints about speeding on Encino Rio.

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School Bus Safety Tips

As students go back to school please be aware of school bus rules, respect the speed limits posted as children will be waiting at bus stops, crossing the roads, and walking to and from school. Please take extra caution.



Traffic laws of stopping for school buses cited on <u>www.dps.texas.gov</u>

According to Texas statute, a driver – traveling in either direction on a roadway – must stop when approaching a school bus that is stopped and operating a visual signal. The driver may not proceed until one of the following occurs: the school bus resumes motion; the operator is signaled by the bus driver to proceed; or the visual signal is no longer activated.

If a road is divided only by a left-turning lane, drivers on both sides of the roadway must stop for school buses with alternating red flashing lights activated. However, if the lanes are separated by an intervening space or physical barrier, only motorists traveling in the same direction as the bus are required to stop.

Back to School Recipe

Pizza Puffs

Ingredients:

- 1 loaf (1 pound) frozen pizza dough, thawed
- 20 slices pepperoni
- 8 ounces part-skim mozzarella cheese, cut into 20 cubes
- 1/4 cup butter
- 2 small garlic cloves, minced
- Dash salt
- · Marinara sauce, warmed
- Parmesan cheese (optional)



Directions:

Preheat oven to 400°. Shape dough into 1-1/2-in. balls; flatten into 1/8-in. thick circles. Place 1 pepperoni slice and 1 cheese cube in center of each circle; wrap dough around pepperoni and cheese. Pinch edges to seal; shape into a ball. Repeat with remaining dough, cheese and pepperoni. Place seam side down on greased baking sheets; bake until light golden brown, 10-15 minutes. Cool slightly.

Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, melt butter over low heat. Add garlic and salt, taking care not to brown butter or garlic; brush over puffs. Serve with marinara sauce; if desired, sprinkle with red pepper flakes and Parmesan.

LOCK, TAKE, HIDE

One of the easiest ways to prevent becoming a crime victim is to lock your car doors. Leaving cars unlocked in your driveway allows easy access to see what can be stolen. Please keep the crime tip of LOCK, TAKE, HIDE in mind. Lock, Take, and Hide is an easy 3-step plan that drastically reduces your chances of becoming a victim:



- 1. Lock your car doors.
- 2. Take your keys and valuables with you. (This includes cell phones, wallets/purses, GPS units, computers, weapons, and jewelry).
- 3. Hide those valuables so they aren't in plain sight.

Household Hazardous Waste

Not all household products can be thrown in the regular garbage. Being informed can help you make smarter, safer disposal decisions. You will likely find at least one thing you thought was safe to toss, but is on the list of common household hazardous waste materials. These items should not be mixed with your regular garbage or recyclables. Household hazardous wastes require special handling.

Household hazardous waste consists of materials that pose potential threats to people and the environment, such as:

- · Flammable products
- Oil
- · Paint cans
- · Pool chemicals
- · Animal carcasses
- Solvents
- Household cleaning products
- · Motor oil
- · Mercury thermometers
- Personal care products (e.g. medicine, sunscreen, insect repellent, etc.)
- · Medicine

- Lead, acid/wet cell batteries
- · Railroad ties
- Toxic materials
- Biohazardous materials or waste
- Propane/oxygen/helium tanks
- · Items containing gas or oil
- Explosives
- Live ammunition or weapons





MAINTENANCE EVERY HOMEOWNER SHOULD DO

Owning a home can be a wonderful milestone in one's life. However, there are certain responsibilities when it comes to maintaining your home and protecting your investment. Staying on top of these tasks is paramount to keeping your home in top shape while saving money on unexpected home repairs.

Clean kitchen exhaust hood and air filter to remove dust, grease, and grime. Instead of spending money on expensive cleaning products, try mixing hot water and dish soap to use as a cleaner. Another option is to try using a mixture of one part vinegar to one part water. Baking soda is also useful because it neutralizes acidic compounds on the vent screen. Soak screen in hot water and baking soda for about 15 minutes to remove buildup. Keeping your vent hood clean has many benefits such as cleaner air in the kitchen, fire risk reduction, reduces the need for repairs and maintenance, and increases energy efficiency.

Vacuum your refrigerator's coils to remove dust and debris. The first thing to do here is to unplug your refrigerator to prevent electric shock. This should only take 10 or 15 minutes, so your food will be fine. Next, locate your refrigerator coils. Newer refrigerators have a vent at the bottom and older refrigerators usually have coils in the back of the refrigerator. Once you remove the vent cover, you will see the coils there. Vacuum all of the dust off the coils and the fan. The long-term benefits of this maintenance task are that it prevents your refrigerator from having to work harder, which increases energy use and the life of your product. Typical average savings after cleaning the coils is approximately 11%.

Clean or Replace Faucet Aerator to increase water pressure. If you notice a faucet doesn't seem to have the same water pressure it once did, the problem may be the aerator. Aerators have a small mesh screen that is used to conserve both water and energy. Aerators are located inside the tip of the water faucet spout. This part gets clogged with lime, calcium, and sediment over time. Use a toothbrush or soft bristle brush to loosen up mineral deposits in the aerator screen. Cleaning the faucet aerator has several benefits including using less water, increased water pressure, less water used, and lower water bills.
