WE'RE GLAD YOU ASKED!

Question: With the record heat we had this past summer, what are we doing to ensure our plants and trees in the common areas survive and thrive?

Answer: Questions have come up at several board meetings about the grounds maintenance and we wanted to make sure that you know we hear you and are investigating all suggestions and options. Over the summer, we priced the water bags that wrap around trees and found the process and expense is more than we thought. We would have to hire a water truck to refill the water bags weekly because the water evaporates 5-7 days after filled. We were able to repair 2 of our dead sprinkler heads so the median from the gas station to the pool can now be regularly watered. The original water spickets by the Encino Park entry sign and the entry into Forest Village were unfortunately capped by the city years ago and do not have any water access. We entertained asking neighbors to use their water supply to water any surrounding community greenspaces, but, with water bills already so high, we knew how important it is to maintain personal budgets.

The EP Board and Spectrum are working closely with our landscaping company regarding removal of the dead items and we're finding more drought friendly plants and cacti for the future. 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Winter Irrigation Antonio Water Makes Your Sewer Bills System and Weeds Grow!

Ok everyone, let's have a show of hands to see how many of you run your irrigation systems at least once per week during the winter? Now, ask yourself why because......

Dormant Grass Won't Grow!

First, you must understand that irrigating dormant grass <u>will not</u> make it grow, no matter how hard you try or how much water you apply. <u>As long as soil temperatures are below 70°F</u>, warm season turf grasses <u>will not</u> produce green shoots that require mowing or irrigation. Only the roots of grasses, trees and shrubs are active in the winter and generally survive on the sporadic rainfall that the area receives. What WILL turn green because of irrigation are the germinating winter weeds like dandelions and henbit, along with cool-season weedy grasses such as rye, fescue, Poa anna, and Rescue grass.

Lower those Sewer Charges

Why is NOT irrigating in the winter important? <u>Your sewer bill</u>. Yes! Your sewer bill! SAWS uses the period between November 15 and March 15 each year to calculate the <u>winter average</u>. SAWS averages the water consumption over three consecutive billing periods during the above timeframe to calculate the monthly sewer billing charges starting on April 1 of the following year.

Pay Attention to Consumption

If you are irrigating, draining and refilling a pool/spa, or have a bad unrepaired leak during this three-month period, you will see this higher consumption reflected in your metered domestic water use and will be included in that winter average sewer calculation. If you repair a leak during the winter averaging period, call SAWS Customer Service so a bill review can be performed and adjust for the leak (leak repair receipts MUST be provided) to make sure the sewer charges are accurate and don't include the extra water caused by the leak. NOTE: Irrigation, filling a pool/spa, and regular consumption during the winter averaging period are not eligible for adjustments.

Next time you're in the garage (or wherever your irrigation controller is installed), stop by "Hunter" or "Rain Bird" (whatever your brand of irrigation controller) and switch them to <u>OFF</u> or <u>Manual</u> between **NOVEMBER 15 AND MARCH 15.** Your budget will appreciate the attention to detail!
